Voluntary	Children choose to do something but other children can be invites to join in – <i>Freedom to explore</i>	
Pleasurable	A deep sense of enjoyment, which will vary from child to child – Passionate interest is apparent. Calm, concentration, invigorated.	
Symbolic	Usually includes some type of creative thinking where objects assume new meanings and purposes for the children.	
Meaningful	To the children, but the meaning may not always be clear to an observer – Purposeful, linked to acquisition of one's own culture.	
Active	It requires active mental, verbal or physical engagement with people, objects or ideas – Involves movement, coordination.	
Process Orientated	It's enjoyed for the activity itself, not concerned with an end product – Absorbent mind attracts children to stimuli, pride in 'doing'.	
Intrinsically motivated	It is its own reward - Joy from self-construction.
